
PiXL Reading SECONDARY NEWSLETTER

Whatever your child is curious about, or takes interest in, look at books around the topic, or encourage them to research into the area further through non-fiction texts such as online articles. As part of PiXL's Let's Talk programme this half term, we'll be exploring the power each of us has to change the world and also choices: the choices open to us and how we can make the best ones. Many of the books in these pages link to these areas and we hope your child may be inspired to make positive changes to the world and to consider the choices available to them in life.

Please note that unless otherwise stated, the texts shared in this newsletter are suitable from Year 7 and up, but please do research the books before selecting them to ensure that they are appropriate for your child, as these are just the publisher's guide.

If your child is struggling to read, please do speak to your school about this before the summer, and explore ways you could support them at home. For example, by reading with them, to them, and encouraging them to find a book which suits their interests as well as their reading level. We hope that this selection may spark some ideas for this. However, it's also worth bearing in mind that some students prefer to 'read' through audio books and that this is still a valid form of them hearing the written word in a

fluent and expressive way.





The Disconnect


KEREN DAVID


Born in 1876, Princess



The Boy at the Back of the Class ONJALI Q. RAÚF



The Dawn of Adonis



world of corrupt and desperate politicians. As Gloria becomes aware of the forces toying with her every move, she must make decisions that could save, or end, thousands of lives - including her own...




Uglies

Tally can't wait. But then, with just weeks to go to



Hope on the Horizon


ONJALI Q. RAÚF


Al for Beginners PUBLISHING IN JULY
