KS3 Curriculum Information (Years 7 and 8)

Throughout KS3, Religious Education & Ethics is taught by a member of the Humanities team with students receiving two lessons per fortnight. A wide variety of topics are studied as part of the curriculum with a focus on breadth of study, and an opportunity for pupils to express and justify their own personal beliefs in a safe, supported and structured environment.

Year 7 lessons will focus on topics including:

- What is Religion?
- Religious Rebels.
- Rights, values and responsibilities.
- Do religious people have to care about others?
- Pilgrimage
- Religion: Can it really be true?

In Year 8, students will study:

- Asylum seekers and refugees.
- Equality.
- Is Religion Dangerous?
- Can Israel and Palestine find peace?
- Diversity.
- Remembering and celebrating.

KS4 Curriculum Information (Years 9, 10 and 11)

At Year 9 RS is offered as an option at GCSE with students following the AQA A 1-9 Christianity and Islam paper. This program of study focuses on both Christian and Muslim beliefs and practices within Year 9-10, with students in year 11 looking at the following ethical topics;

- Religion and Life
- Arguments for the existence of God and revelation
- Religion, Crime and Punishment
- Religion, human rights and social justice



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KS4 Curriculum Information (Years 9, 10 and 11) continued

Those students who do not want to take RS as a GCSE choice will have one lesson fortnightly focusing on the following topics;

- Crime and Punishment
- Relationships
- Life after Death
- Religion, human rights and social justice
- Religion, peace and conflict

Extended Learning

Students are offered booster revision classes leading up to GCSEs. These can take the form of after school sessions, Saturday school or holiday intervention.
