Grayson Perry is one Britain's leading contemporary artists. He has been hosting a series of art workshop programmes on C4 over the lockdown period. Episode 4 discusses the theme a 'view from my window'

- Why does a person's view form the window differ? Make notes about what the artists in the programme have seen through their window or how they have interpreted the theme.
- Which art work did you engage with/find the most interesting? Explain why?
- How has art helped people during isolation?
- Something new you have learnt from watching the programme.

Task: Respond to the theme of 'View form my Window'

This does not have to a literal response; you do not have to draw what you can actually see.

1. Brainstorm

Make notes: What would you like to see? What do you aspire to see from your window? What can you not see? What can you actually see? How does the view change in different rooms? What colour, shapes, pattern stand out? What is beyond your window? How do you feel being inside looking out? Do you feel protected, trapped, isolated? What is the view looking in? What is reflected back at you? How have people's windows changed? How do they reflect society at the moment?

2. Collect images

Choose 3 of the ideas from your brainstorm to collect images, articles and information. This could be artist's work; you could look in more depth at one of the artists from the programme. You could use images/ articles from the news as a starting point for ideas. Your own photographs. Poems, songs can also be an inspiration for art work.

3. Sketches

Thumb nail sketches/ photographs based on some of your initial ideas and responses to this theme. Develop these ideas by producing media studies, composition ideas, take more photographs, edit.

4. Outcome

Choose one of your initial ideas and produce a final outcome or series of outcomes.



The artist below could be used as starting points for your response to the theme 'a view from my window'. You do not have to use any of these artists, you are encouraged to do your own research. Remember that you do not have to produce a literal response of what you can actually see.


