Dear Year 11,

Re: Transition to Key Stage 5

I hope that you are all well, that you have been keeping active and that you have continued to focus on 'The Consolidation Phase' of your studies over the last six weeks. Ms Lawner, Mr Wheel, your tutors and I have, once again, really enjoyed being able to speak to so many of you; we will continue making these calls when we return from half term to ensure that we have spoken to all of you.

As we reach the end of the half term holiday, it seems strange to think that you should have been preparing for your few remaining exams and eagerly anticipating the last of these on the 12th June. Whilst we were all so disappointed that the exams were cancelled, we are now presented with an opportunity that we must capitalise on. We now have the time, that Year 11 have never had before, to really prepare you for your transition to the Sixth Form and you will now begin Phase Two of your studies - 'Transition to A Level'.

The transition from GCSE to A Level is a huge academic leap. We want to ensure that you are prepared for this next step in your education by introducing you to the challenging A Level content through the transition work which has been set by your A Level teachers and Heads of Department.

All Level 3 subjects require students to research topics, complete readings or to complete a project prior to starting the course. You should complete work for all courses that you have applied for. It is important to note that completion of this work does not guarantee your place on the course and, whilst you have been made a provisional offer, as usual, we must still wait for your confirmed results on 20th August.
